
Interested applicants do not need to apply to the VN program to take the general education core courses. In order to apply to the Veterinary Nursing Program, all applicants must meet the MSC admission requirements as well as the following:

1. Enhanced National ACT composite score of 19 or above and sub-scores of 19 or above. SAT sub-scores above 480 SAT2/PSAT102 in Evidence Based-Reading & Writing and 530 in Math.
 - a. Deficiency in sub-scores can be removed by taking appropriate courses.
2. An accumulative GPA of at least 2.0 on all completed college course work.

Admission Procedure

1. Submit a Murray State College application (www.msco.edu)
2. Submit to the admissions office all of the following AND request a copy of each be sent to the Veterinary Nursing Program:
 - a. Official high school transcript
 - b. Official ACT or SAT &/or ACCUPLACER Score Reports
 - c. Official college transcripts for any and all colleges attended
3. Submit a completed Veterinary Nursing Application to the Veterinary Nursing Office.
4. Submit to the Veterinary Nursing Program all of the following:
 - a. Immunization record
 - Rabies Pre-exposure vaccination or adequate titer levels if previously vaccinated
 - b. Two letters of recommendation
 - c. Clinical Observation Record Complete a minimum of 16 hours of observation in a veterinary clinical facility.
5. Student must be able to meet the Essential Functions requirements for Veterinary Technicians. A detailed list of these requirements is available in the Veterinary Nursing Application on the web page.
6. Students accepted into the Program are required to attend a Veterinary Nursing Orientation, prior to beginning the program.
7. Students accepted into the Program are required to have a complete primary series of rabies pre-exposure vaccine administered prior to direct contact with animals. If previously vaccinated for rabies the student must have serum antibody levels checked, with a booster dose of rabies vaccine administered if the titer is inadequate according to current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines.

Admission Selection

1. Only completed applications with all documents will be considered for acceptance.
2. Acceptance into the MSC Veterinary Nursing Program is competitive. Applicants will be awarded points and ranked according to the admission point system. The Veterinary Nursing Selection Committee will make the final determination regarding applicant ranking, total selection point calculations, and acceptance into the program.
3. Applicants having identical selection point totals will be ranked by the following criteria:
 - a. ACT composite score
 - b. ACT sub-scores in Evidence Based-Reading & Writing and Math
 - c. SAT sub-scores in Evidence Based-Reading & Writing and Math
 - d. Official college transcripts for any and all colleges attended
 - e. Official ACT or SAT &/or ACCUPLACER Score Reports
 - f. Official high school transcript
 - g. Two letters of recommendation
 - h. Clinical Observation Record
 - i. Rabies Pre-exposure vaccination or adequate titer levels if previously vaccinated

Readmission to the Veterinary Nursing Program

Once accepted into the Veterinary Nursing program and a student discontinues the program for any reason, they may be readmitted to the program in accordance with the following:
